ITEM 4 SAFETY UPDATE

General Manager Marine Phil Christy Pilbara Ports' Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate is 4.98.

ITEM 5 MARINE OPERATIONS UPDATE

Harbour Master Regional Ports Anurodh Prasad

- On 11 July, PPA held their annual Oil Spill Response Exercise at the Port of Ashburton. The exercise involved stakeholders including government agencies DoT, MRL Chevron and Base Marine. The exercise tests the port's readiness to deal with an oil spill emergency and reviews its first strike plan against the evolving operations of the port. Furthermore, a new updated oil spill response vessel is expected to be delivered by the end of the year.
- Attendees were reminded to adhere to the boating safety exclusion zones at the Port
 of Ashburton as per PPA's recreational vessel safety campaign as well as using
 channel 14 or 16 to contact the Vessel Traffic Services. All skippers are to stay well
 clear of shipping channels and restricted waterside areas to keep themselves and their



passengers safe. Bulk carriers have a blind spot that extends for hundreds of meters and cannot change course quickly, their stopping distance extending several hundred metres. More education on the

ITEM 6 LANDSIDE OPERATIONS UPDATE

Landside Operations Superintendent (Dampier) Jeremy Smith General Update:

- New Port Manager role at the Port of Ashburton. Currently, Pilbara Ports has coordinators in rotation to cover 24/7 support.
- Pilbara Ports recently increased awareness on all safety matters.
- The Port of Ashburton is continuing its development with land activation including:
 - New Biosecurity pad
 - First point of entry
 - Approved arrangement
 - New projects and leases

ITEM 7 ENVIRONMENT AND HERITAGE UPDATE

Environment and Heritage Manager Dave Pozzari

Updates were provided on the following environment monitoring programs:

- Marine Environmental Quality Monitoring Program (MEQSAP): the purpose is to provide a framework to monitor, characterise and report long-term trends in marine water and sediment quality within the Port of Ashburton and surrounding waters. This will involve two distinct monitoring phases:
 - Phase 1 (Years 1-3) Initial Baseline Data Collection; and
 - Phase 2 (Post-year 3) Monitor & Investigate.

The annual monitoring program includes quarterly water quality sampling and annual sediment quality sampling spread over the annual reporting period. The sampling program includes a total of eight monitoring locations.

• **Sand bypassing:** In 2021, PPA commissioned a long-term sand bypassing options assessment – taking into consideration the site-specific challenges. The favored option is a dig and pump which would involve mechanical collection of sand by land based mobile plant, and hydraulic transportation of sand as a slurry mix through pipelines with support of booster pumps. The project is expected to start from October 2023 for a 6 to 8-week period.

There was a question regarding where the pipeline will be placed. Pilbara Ports advised that the pipeline will be placed through the port with some segments above grounds and some covert through Mineral Resources facility.

ITEM 8 COMMUNITY UPDATE

Stakeholder Engagement Advisor Ariana St-Pierre



- **CSI:** Community groups can apply for up to \$10,000 in small grants through PPA's Community Support Initiative (CSI). Applications are accepted year-round from community groups in Port Hedland, Dampier/Karratha, and Onslow.
- PPA has recently supported:
 - **Shire of Ashburton:** \$20,000 towards Passion of the Pilbara
 - Telethon Speech and Hearing: \$4,450 for the purchase of new equipment
 - Ashburton Anglers:
 - \$2,500 towards the MACK10k 2023 fishing competition,
 - \$2,500 towards Beadon Bay Bash
 - **Onslow Rodeo:** \$5,000
