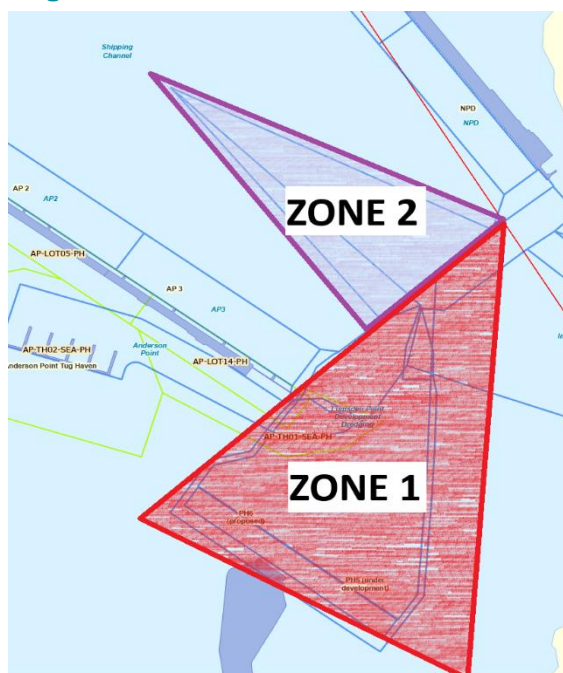

Mariners and port users are advised that activities relating to the Lumsden Point Dredging & Reclamation works are expected to commence on 30 September 2024 and expected to be ongoing for nine to ten weeks.

The dredging work will be completed in two phases:

- Phase 1 (zone 1 as per figure 1) incorporates work East of a bearing connecting berth's AP3 and NPD.
- Phase 2 (zone 2 as per figure 1) is located over the "Wedge". Work in zone 2 is expected to start in the first week of November 2024, or soon after.

All Mariners and Port users are to be aware that the J.F.J De Nul will have a steel floating pipeline extending between the dredger and Lumsden Point. All vessel traffic to remain a safe distance of this pipeline and all associated equipment.

All vessels involved in the dredging campaign will be maintaining a watch on VHF channel 12 and 16 and will display the appropriate lights and shapes as required by the COLREGS.

Mariners should exercise caution when navigating in or near the vicinity of the dredging and surveying works.

All incidents shall be reported to the PH VTS on VHF 12 or 16 or by calling 08 9173 9030 as soon as practicable.
